In the spring of 1994, a plane crash takes the life of an African president and ignites a killing spree that the world will later recognise as the Rwandan genocide. The person who is next in line for the country's presidency — and who will, in fact, become the country's head of state for less than a day — is Agathe Uwilingiyimana, a university professor and an advocate for women and girls' education. A beacon for our times, her silenced story and brave spirit are brought to life in this riveting play, inspired by true but overlooked history.

AGATHE was a top-four finalist for the prestigious Jane Chambers Award and received several other honours including the Henley Rose Award, Landing Theatre New American Voices Award, and the SETC Getchell Award.
